

FRENCH COMPOSITION CORRECTION KEY

This key is designed to help you in rewriting written assignments in French class. Please refer to the table of contents or the index/appendix in the back of your book to help apply grammar codes to your corrections. For spelling or vocabulary mistakes, refer to the chapters or your glossary/dictionary.

The appearance of one of these codes means something is wrong: for example, if you see ACC it means there should be an accent but it is missing, the accent you put is wrong, the accent is in the wrong place, or there should be no accent at all.

If you're unsure what a code means, you can ask your instructor. Note: Your instructor can help you understand what the problem is, but you have to find the right way to correct it on your own.

Your teacher may provide you with additional codes that he or she may use while grading your compositions.

If your teacher writes: it means you have made the following kind of error:
